Bert Dannheisser, '52 named 2002 Distinguished Alumnus



Distinguished Alumnus Bert Dannheisser.

Each year the Dental Alumni Association names a Distinguished Alumnus, and this year Bert Dannheisser of the Class of 1952, was chosen as recipient of this honor. He is being recognized for his many and outstanding contributions in the field of dentistry as well as for his leadership role in his community.

Bert was born and raised in Pensacola, Florida where his father, Bertram V. Dannheisser, Sr. prac-

ticed dentistry for 68 years. A product of the Pensacola public schools, Bert served in the USNR, 1945-46, after which he took pre-dental training first at Tulane University (46-47) and then Emory (47-48). He entered Washington University School of Dentistry in 1948, graduating in 1952. He served two more years in the Navy as a dental officer and started his practice in Pensacola in 1954.

Through his many years of practice he has served the Florida Dental Association as well as his community in many capacities. He has served on the staff of three hospitals in the 56 years between 1954 and 2000. He has been President of his local dental association, his district dental society and the Florida Dental Association, which he also served as Trustee and as Delegate the the ADA

for 12 years. One of his most important duties was his service of 18 years (1978-1996) as Editor of the Florida Dental Journal. He not only served as President of the American Association of Dental Editors, he was honored by the International College of Dentists as Outstanding Dental Editor three different years (1982, 1990 and 1991).

The 136th Annual Meeting

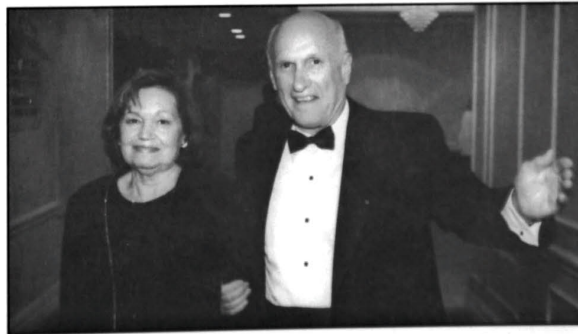

David and Goliath Rem

Joseph B. Kimbrough graduated from Washington University School of Dental Medicine in 1894. Dr. Kimbrough died in 1963. He was an enthusiastic and generous supporter of the dental school. He was also quite generous with monetary gifts directly to Washington University. Before his death, Dr. Kimbrough established a Trust that provided income for his niece and nephews during their lifetimes. After their death the Trust was to be distributed as follows:

"Upon the death of the survivor of said niece and nephews and after death of the Grantor, the property then constituting the trust estate shall be paid over and distributed free from the trust unto Washington University, St. Louis, Missouri, for the exclusive use and benefit of its Dental Alumni Development Fund."

During the summer of 2001, the Washington University Dental Alumni Association (WUDAA) received word that the heirs of the niece and nephews

mentioned above had alleged that by reason of the closing of the Dental School, a lapse had occurred in the Kimbrough Trust and they were therefore entitled to receive the remainder of the trust, approximately \$2.8 million. Shortly thereafter, the WUDAA also learned that Washington University (main campus) had presented the argument that they were entitled to receive the proceeds of the Trust.

During the late summer and early fall of 2001 the Executive Committee of the WUDAA met numerous times for the sole purpose of deciding the course of action, if any. Legal counsel was obtained and, based upon their recommendation, the Executive Committee decided to proceed with the effort to protect the interests of the Alumni of Washington University School of Dental Medicine.

The Executive Committee felt strongly that Dr. Kimbrough's intentions would be well served by establishing a Continuing Education program. Historically, the Dental Alumni Development fund (the benefactor

of the Trust) had been utilized to promote the Dental School through the support of its Alumni. The requirement for Continuing Education did not exist at the time Dr. Kimbrough created his Trust. However, when one analyzes Dr. Kimbrough's own words, "the exclusive use and benefit of its Dental Alumni Development fund", it seems that the spirit calls out for the continued development, i.e., the continued education, of our Alumni.

A detailed Continuing Education program was produced, including specific financial arrangements, plans for implementation and management, and the intent to move the program around the country to better serve more of our Alumni as well as other dental professionals. This proposal included historical evidence of how the Dental Alumni Development Fund had been used to the benefit of the Dental School during its existence.

This proposal for the Continuing Education program was presented to Washington

University in an attempt to reach an agreement out of court with the University regarding the proceeds of the Trust. We were willing to fully acknowledge two facts: 1) the Washington University Dental Alumni Association has a finite future, therefore, 2) the Trust proceeds would eventually revert back to Washington University. Using a conservative interest rate figure, we determined that the budget for the Continuing Education program could have been met by using INTEREST ONLY from the Trust. The principal would NOT have been spent down and Washington University would eventually get the entire \$2.8 million. An agreement with the University would have eliminated a large amount of preparation time, court time and legal expenses. No agreement was reached. The response from Washington University made their intentions quite clear. **They wanted the money, they wanted it all and they wanted it now.**

As the proceedings went to court, it was

clear to legal counsel that the heirs had the weakest case because of very specific wording of the Trust. The gray area that allowed Washington University (main campus) to enter the arena was a result of the wording of the Trust, "unto Washington University, St. Louis, Missouri, for the exclusive use and benefit of its Dental Alumni Development Fund." The University argued that the Trust gave the money to the University, FIRST AND FOREMOST, and since the Dental Alumni Development Fund no longer existed, the University was free to use the money as it saw fit.

The decision of the courts was received in May of 2002. The decision found that the Dental Alumni Development Fund no longer exists. The court also found that "the Washington University Dental Alumni Association seeks the trust funds for educational purposes, but it possesses no history or structure reasonably demonstrating that it could safely transform itself from a largely social entity to an educational one." However, it was clear

to the courts that the intent of the Trust was "to fund and support educational programs and projects in dental and medical field at Washington University."

The court ordered that the assets of the Trust be distributed to Washington University "to further dental medicine by creating, establishing, funding and maintaining the Dr. Joseph B. Kimbrough Chair in the Cleft Palate/Cranio-facial Deformities Institute for teaching or healing OR the Dr. Joseph B. Kimbrough Chair for Maxillofacial Surgery and Prosthodontics in the Washington University Department of Otolaryngology for teaching and healing OR both and for no other purpose."

At this time, the Executive Committee of the WUDAA has decided to take no further action. **However, we feel that it is important for our graduates to understand the nature of the action taken against its own by Washington University.** Washington University is one of the top ten endowed universities in the country,

with endowments in excess of \$4 billion. Why would our alma mater take this kind of action against its own graduates, over a mere \$2.8 million? This is pocket change for the University AND money which would have reverted to them eventually. For the Washington University Dental Alumni, the interest alone would have allowed the WUDAA to create a much needed Continuing Education program which would have benefited any alumnus or non-alumnus dental professional to continue to expand his/her dental education.

We can only hope that someone truly in need will eventually benefit from Dr. Kimbrough's wishes. "Goliath" seems free to use the proceeds of the Trust, without accountability, to fund just about anything above the neck. While "David" has lost this round, perhaps our Alumni will take action to turn this set-back into something positive, something consistent with Dr. Kimbrough's true intent.

Our Alumni have the wisdom and foresight to understand the need for and the benefit of more Continuing Education. Our goal is to become an Alumni Association that provides Continuing Education for our membership and other dental professionals. The Executive Committee of the WUDAA has taken steps in our endeavor to create an Endowment Fund for the Alumni Association. We have obtained the tax status of a charitable 501-C-3 corporation. Should your estate planning include WU School of Dental Medicine or if you wish to consider such planning in the future, we now qualify as a charitable corporation. Joe Haganbruch, '82, is currently serving as the Secretary of the Illinois State Dental Society. He and other dentists from Illinois attended the American Dental Society Leadership Conference in Washington, DC in March of 2002. They were in the company of some 450 dental leaders and members of grassroots groups who met with congressional staff to discuss health and dental care poli-

cies. The Illinois attendees met with Rep. Don Manzullo (R-III) and expressed concern with numerous issues. Specifically, the Illinois delegation addressed concern regarding IRS changes. They were successful in their attempts to keep the IRS from changing accounting methods from cash to accrual methods. Also, they expressed concern regarding an Executive Order which interprets

the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Currently, this interpretation calls for any medical, dental or social service provider which receives federal aid to provide interpretation services as needed at no charge to the client.

John Mahoney, '55, donated the use of his office for 2 days recently for the Give Kids a Smile program in St. Louis. This charitable dental program

was a resounding success. There were 65 dentists, 59 dental hygienists and 127 volunteer ambassadors on hand for the 2 day event which provided dental care for 325 needy St. Louis children, many of whom had never visited a dentist before. The success of the St. Louis Give Kids a smile program was so profound that it is now being used as a prototype for a national event to call

attention to access problems among children from low-income families and underscore the dental profession's commitment to this segment of the patient population. Thank you to all of the volunteers who participated in this event.

Ralph Montgomery, '54, founder of Salt Lake Donated Dental Services (SLDDS), was awarded with the Governor's Points of Light Award at the State Capital September 3, 2002. Through Dr. Montgomery's leadership, SLDDS has become the largest volunteer dental organization in the country. Borne of a Rotary mission in the Philippines, the effort has now provided more than \$5 million worth of care to 25,000 people. Ralph's crowning achievement is the state-of-art facility built from the ground up for indigent care. There

are few like it in the world and it is especially noteworthy that this facility was completely donated by the community for the community.

Gordon Thompson, '52, and Marvin Wallach, '52, and Harry Bozoian were recognized at the Missouri State Capitol by the House of Representatives and the Senate for 50 years of service to the dental profession. They were honored in Jefferson City, MO in January 2003 in front of the 92nd General Assembly. We have included Harry Bozoian in this publication because he has two sons who are WUSDM Alumni, **Steve Bozoian, '81,** and **Paul Boxoian, '82.**

Kurt Studt, '66, has announced that his son, Gregory Studt, has joined him in the practice of General and Family Dentistry in

St. Louis. Greg graduated from the Dental School at University of Missouri in Kansas City in 1999. He then spent 3 years in the air Force where he completed the Advanced Education program for General Dentists.

Gifts from alumni and friends supporting the Harriett Steuernagel Library Fund continue to come in to the Medical School Library. The following chart illustrates the gift totals:

Funds spent during FY02 to keep Collection current - \$41,664.00

(Funds are used to pay for journal renewal subscriptions and individual purchases of dental titles and electronic journals. \$10,000 was spent to establish the Harriett Steuernagel Award with the Medical Library Association. Additional money, not spent during a fiscal year is plowed back into the endowment)

The Steuernagel Collection contains approximately 90 titles (magazines/journals) as well as a large collection of dental books, electronic resource access and other information for research and reference.

During 2000-01, close to 800 titles were checked out. *(Note: the usage of the Collection is based on the library personnel returning the titles to their sections.)*

The Library added 6 dental journals to their on-line collection of general medical and dental resources. "OVID," the on-line collection access is available to all alumni and dental practitioners for a \$52.00 annual fee.

The Harriett Steuernagel Award of the Dental Section of the MLA (Medical Library Association) has been established to annually recognize the efforts a health sciences librarian who has contributed to the growth and development of the Dental Section. A donation of \$10,000 was contributed by the WU Medical School Library (from the Steuernagel Library Fund at WU) to provide an endowment that funds this annual award.

The upcoming Earl Shepard Memorial Lecture is scheduled for April 9, 2003.

The heirs of Dr. and Mrs. Earl Shepard endowed the Dept. of Otolaryngology at WUSM with a fund to endow a lectureship series. In 1994, a sum of \$50,000 was used to establish the endowment. The following chart illustrates the funds \$ history:

Faculty Obituaries

Dr. Jack Dann - John Joseph "Jack" Dann died from complications of a stroke June 25, 2002. Dr. Dann graduated from St. Louis University School of Dentistry in 1945. Afterward, he joined the Naval Reserve and was active for two years. He operated his private practice, Dann Dental Associates, in Brentwood, MO for 41 years until retiring in 1988. He was a founding member and past president of the St. Louis General Practice Research Group and St. Louis Practice Administration

Study Club.

Dr. Dann was a member of the faculty at Washington University School of Dental Medicine in the Periodontics and Restorative Dentistry departments from the mid 80's until the school closed.

Dr. Dann was also very active as a community volunteer. He lived in a beautiful area of west St. Louis County and was instrumental in the incorporation of the city that come to be known as Wildwood, MO. After the incorporation, he was elected as one of 13 commis-

sioners who wrote the city's governing Charter. He also enjoyed photography and was a Civil War buff.

Dr. Harold Rosenthal - Dr. Harold L. Rosenthal, Ph.D., retired professor emeritus of biochemistry and biomedical sciences, died on October 25, 2002, of a pulmonary embolism. He was chair of the Department of Physiological Chemistry at the dental school from 1958 until his retirement in 1987. Although he was active in many research projects, he is probably best remembered for his leadership

role in the analysis of baby teeth collected during the St. Louis Baby Tooth Survey (1959-1970). These pivotal tests showed that strontium-90 levels in baby teeth rose and fell over the years in unison with atomic bomb testing. The study was instrumental in persuading President Kennedy to adopt a 1963 treaty banning atmospheric bomb tests. He is survived by his wife Rose at 572 Coeur de Royale #104, St. Louis, MO 63141, two daughter and four grandsons.
