Les Cutler, '68 Named 2003 Distinguished Alumnus



Distinguished Alumnus Les Cutler.

Each year the Dental Alumni Association names a Distinguished Alumnus, and this year Leslie S. Cutler of the Class of 1968, was chosen as recipient of the honor. He was recognized for his many outstanding contributions to dental education.

Les was born in New Jersey and moved to Los Angeles with his family where he graduated high school and received his undergraduate education.

After graduation from Washington University School of Dental Medicine in 1968, Les obtained his Ph.D. in Experimental Pathology from the School of Medicine, State Univer-

sity of New York, at Buffalo, N.Y. in 1973. Les then began his career dental education at the University of Connecticut. From 1973-2001, Les served as an Assistant, Associate, and full Professor in the Departments of Oral Biology and Pathology. Les was named Chairman of the Department of Oral Diagnosis for the University Connecticut School of Dental Medicine from 1987-1992. In 1988, Les was presented the Outstanding Teacher Award from the University of Connecticut Health Center.

In 1992, Les was appointed Chancellor and Provost for Health Affairs and Vice President for Health Affairs for the UConn Health Center and President of UConn Health Center Finance Corporation. In 1994, Les became President of University Connecticut Health System, where he served as the CEO for John Dempsey Hospital, the UConn Medical/Dental Group and Correctional Managed Health Care until 1999. In 1997, Les received the Technology Business Leader of the Year Award from the Greater Hartford Chamber of Commerce. Les also served as the Chief Science and Technology Business Officer for the UConn Health System from 1999-2001.

Les founded nABL-Health in 1999, a company that provided wearable, wireless medical monitors.

Les has served on the Board of Directors for the Connecticut Capital Region Growth Council, the Connecticut Technology Council and the Association of Academic Health Centers. Les has also served on the Connecticut Governor's Economic Competitiveness Team as Co-chair of both the Biotechnology Implementation Health Services Implementation Teams, and the Governor's Economic Development Council.

Excerpts from Dr. Les Cutler's Distinguished Alumnus of the Year Speech

"I took an 'alternative route' in dentistry, forgoing clinical practice to enter a career in academics. As one of only three dentists in the country to run one of the nations 130 academic medical centers, I was often asked to serve on national panels that examined dental education. During these

years I had the honor and privilege to work with many of the finest minds in academic dentistry. My career in academics gave me the chance to see many of the nation's dental schools in a very 'up front and personal fashion.'

I want to tell you, that from all this first-

hand experience, I can honestly sav that Washington University was truly an outstanddental school. Indeed, over years, many of the things I recommended to other schools and national panels were based on things that I learned here at Wash. U. While at UConn, I had the privilege to

help build and hone our relatively new dental school. It is amazing how much of the UConn School of Dental Medicine was modeled on Wash. U. and my Wash. U. experiences. Today, UConn is arguably the best dental school in the country."

Distinguished Alumnus from 1997 Wins ADA's Highest Honor

Orofacial geneticist Dr. Robert J. Gorlin has been named the 2003 recipient of the ADA's Gold Medal Award for Excellence in Dental Research, Dr. Gorlin is the seventh recipient of the ADA's highest honor for research. Dr. Gorlin araduated from Washington University School of Dental Medicine in 1947. He honored with was the Distinguished Alumnus Award in 1997. At the Award Banquet, Dr. Gorlin spoke and presented a slide show that was truly memorable.

Dr. Gorlin has discovered more than 100 syndromes and diseases of the head and neck, including the Gorlin Cyst (calcifying odontogenic cyst) and the Gorlin Syndrome (nevoid basal cell carcinoma syndrome). Dr. Gorlin is the author of

Syndromes of the Head and Neck, a test considered the foremost reference in the field used by both dentists and physicians.

Dr. Gorlin, with a career spanning almost six decades, now joins an elite and very distinguished group of dental researchers who have received the ADA Gold Medal Award for Excellence in Dental

Research. With the award, he will receive a gold medallion, \$25,000 and a paid trip to Chicago for the award's formal presentation. He will also have the opportunity to serve on the Council on Scientific Affairs for a three-year term. Congratulations, Dr. Gorlin!





Gifts from alumni and friends supporting the Harriett Steuernagel Library Fund continue to come in to the Medical School Library. The following chart illustrates the gift totals:

Funds spent during FY03 and to keep the Steuernagel Collection current - Approx. \$30,000

(Funds are used to pay for journal renewal subscriptions and individual purchases of dental titles and electronic journals. Additional money, not spent during a fiscal year is plowed back into the endowment)

The Steuernagel Collection contains approximately 90 titles (magazines/journals) as well as a large collection of dental books, electronic resource access and other information for research and reference.

The Library continues to add dental journals to their on-line collection of general medical and dental resources. "OVID," the on-line collection access is available to all alumni and dental practitioners for a \$52.00 annual fee.

The Library is planning to move more toward on-line access of medical collections, and is therefore planning to designate space for this electronic search mode. Would the Dental Alumni Assn. be interested in designating Steuernagel funds (over and above the annual amount needed for regular renewal and upkeep of Collection) for this effort? Recognition to Harriett and the Alumni Assn. would be located in this new area.

The Harriett Steuernagel Award of the Dental Section of the MLA (Medical Library Association) has been established to annually recognize the efforts of a health sciences librarian who has contributed to the growth and development of the Dental Section. A donation of \$10,000 was contributed in 2002 by the WU Medical School Library (from the Steuernagel Library Fund at WU) to provide an endowment that funds this annual award.

The Earl Shepard Memorial Lecture is scheduled for April 14, 2004 from 9:00 am to 11:00 am at the Eric P. Newman Educational Center. The speaker will be Dr. Bruce Haughey, Director, Division of Head and Neck Surgical Oncology and Associate Professor of Otolaryngology at Washington University School of Medicine. Dr. Haughey's subject will be "Mandibular Reconstruction."

The heirs of Dr. and Mrs. Earl Shepard endowed the Dept. of Otolaryngology at WUSM with a fund to endow a lectureship series. In 1994, a sum of \$50,000 was used to establish the endowment. The following chart illustrates the funds \$ history:

Alumni Association Dues



David and Goliath Revisited – An Update Court Overturns Previous Ruling

In the last Alumni Newsletter, there was a lengthy article about legal action taken by the Alumni Association (WUDAA) in an effort to receive nearly \$3 million left by the trust of Joseph B. Kimbrough, Class of 1894. In the same article, we reported that the assets of the

trust had been ordered to be distributed to Washington University to create a Kimbrough Chair in Cleft Palate/Craniofacial Deformities or Maxillofacial Surgery and Prosthodontics for teaching and healing, ONLY.

One year later, the previous decision has been

reversed in the appeals court in favor of two heirs, Kimbrough's great-great nieces. In reversing the original decision, the appeals court said that Kimbrough had used "unambiguous and binding language" and that he wanted only to benefit the continuation of the dental school. Since the

School of Dental Medicine was closed by the University in 1991, there was no Dental School to benefit from the trust. This final ruling gave the proceeds of the trust to the heirs. The Alumni Association did not participate in the appeal process.
