1998, Joe was named Chinese Father of the Year in Honolulu. This honor recognized not only his devotion to his family but his work in

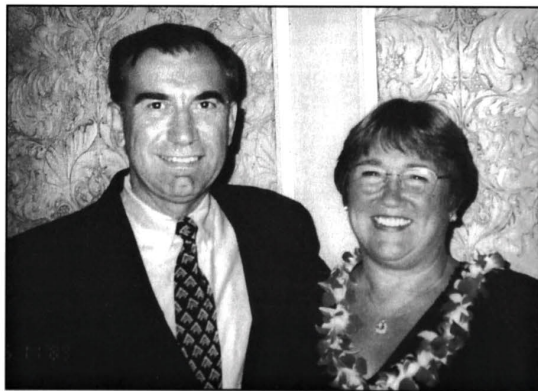

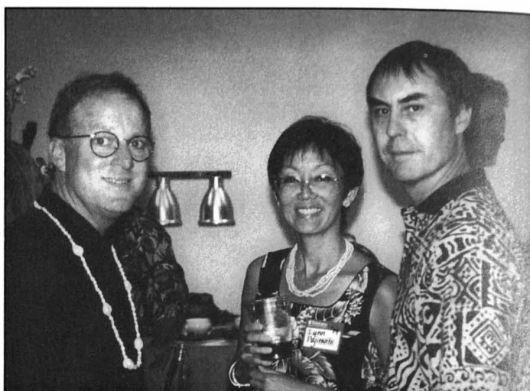

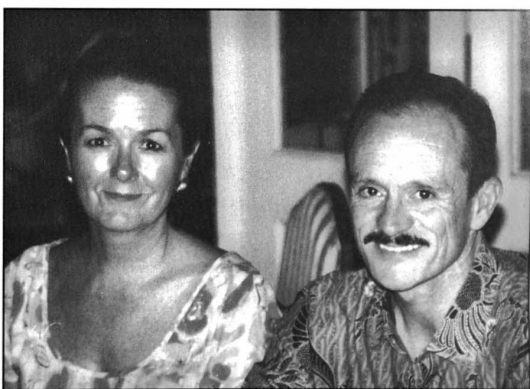

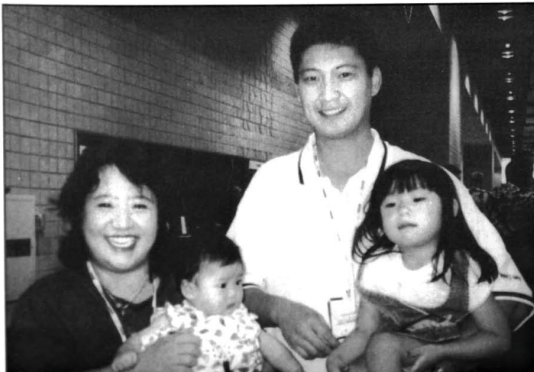

Alumni and School News

David Bensinger, Dean Emeritus of the School, has been named to the Board of Trustees of Notre Dame College in Belmont, California. Dr. Bensinger, who now lives in San Francisco, served on the dental school faculty for some 45 years. He also is a member of the board of the Institute of International Education which manages Fulbright scholars throughout the world.

Barry M. Wyman, '76, retired from the U.S. Air Force Dental Corps on Oct. 1, 1998. He retired as a Colonel after serving more than 22 years on active duty. He now lives in Anchorage, Alaska and is on staff at the Alaska Native Medical Center, where he treats indigenous peoples.

Valerie McDavid, '87, appeared on the program of the Missouri Dental Association's Winter Workshop outlining

Missouri's ADEPT program (Accessing Dental Education for Professional Training). Its essential mission is to increase the base dental knowledge of non-dental health care professionals such as nurses, physicians, pharmacists, respiratory therapists, etc. The presentation also provided attendees with practical resources to be utilized in treating existing patients and receiving new patient referrals.

Gary Shanker, '64, was honored at the annual Scholarship Banquet to benefit the H.F. Epstein Academy in January 1999. The board president of the Academy said that "Gary is such a generous supporter of the Academy because of his conviction that day schools are the bedrock that support all other Jewish institutions". The event was the first to be held in the newly renovated Chase-Park Plaza Hotel on the Starlight Roof.

Report From – David Jolley, Director of Alumni Relations

Gifts from alumni and friends supporting the Harriett Steuernagel Library Fund continue to come in to the Medical School Library. During fiscal year 1998 (1997-98) we received a total of \$8,980.00. During fiscal year 1999 (1998-99) we received \$14,479.00. So far during fiscal year 2000 (1999-00), gifts totaling \$2050 have been received. All gifts have been personally acknowledged by Dr. Mark Frisse, Director of the Medical School Library.

Currently, the Harriett Steuernagel Library Fund has a

market value of \$1,272,433. There is \$39,315 available to spend during FY00. The Medical School Library is managing these funds and applies the available funds toward the enhancement and upkeep of the library collection (dental books and journals).

The most recent Earl Shepard Memorial Lecture (April 14, 1999), featured Dr. Jack Dale and a discussion of occlusion. Approximately 35 guests attended.

The fifth annual Earl Shepard Memorial Lecture Series is

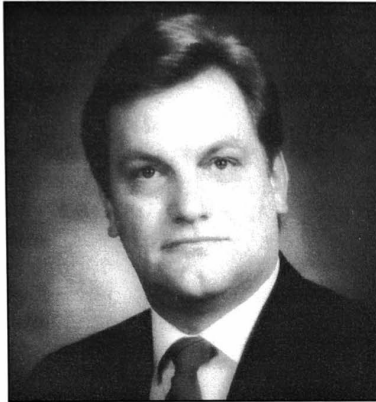
scheduled for Wednesday, April 12, 2000 at the Eric P. Newman Center (WU Medical School campus). The speaker is scheduled to be Colonel Daniel Theberge, an oral and maxillofacial practitioner at Walter Reed Army Hospital. (See related article.)

Alumnus Elected to Congress

Mike Simpson, '77 has been elected to represent Idaho's 2nd District seat in the 106th Congress. Dr. Simpson joins three other dentists in the Congress that convened last January (1999). Mike is the son of the late Keith Simpson, '53 and the nephew of Charles G. Simpson '70.

Michael (Mike) K. Simpson is serving his first term in the House of Representatives for the Second Congressional District of Idaho.

As a freshman, he serves on an unprecedented number of committees. Simpson sits on four full committees and six subcommittees. His committee assignments reflect Idaho's need

for a strong advocate in economic and environmental arenas. His full-committee assignments are Agriculture, Resources, Transportation and Infrastructure, and Veterans Affairs.

Simpson favors smaller government by transferring certain federal responsibilities back to the states. He believes in lowering taxes on married couples, eliminating the death tax and encouraging economic growth for small businesses. He is an advocate of a strong national defense and promoting a stable agriculture economy.

Before being elected to Congress, Simpson served three terms as Speaker of

the Idaho House of Representatives. Simpson earned a reputation for effectively modernizing and streamlining the legislative process. During his tenure as Speaker, he reduced the length of the session by 12 days, saving Idaho taxpayers \$360,000 each year.

As Speaker, he was instrumental in updating House administrative systems and technology, resulting in cost reduction and increased efficiency. Simpson's success led to his appointment as Vice-Chair of the Legislative Effectiveness Committee for the National Conference of State Legislatures.

He also provided strategic leadership in education and tax reform. His work earned him the "Friend of Education" award in April of 1994. Simpson is credited for passing initiatives requiring local governments to advertise and hold public hearings before raising taxes, and lowering property and unemployment insurance taxes.

His political career began in 1980, when he was elected to the Blackfoot City Council. Four years later, he was elected to the legislature where he served fourteen years. His positions included Majority Caucus Chairman and Assistant Majority Leader in the Idaho House of Representatives, along with Speaker of the House. He is a member of the Idaho Republican Party Hall of Fame.

Simpson was born in Burley, Idaho, and raised in Blackfoot where he spent his summers moving irrigation pipe. He graduated from Utah State University and Washington University School of Dental Medicine in St. Louis, Missouri. After graduation, he joined his father and uncle at the family dental practice in Blackfoot.

Simpson is an avid golfer, sporting a handicap of six. He is an avid reader and enjoys painting with water colors. He and his wife, Kathy have been married for 29 years.

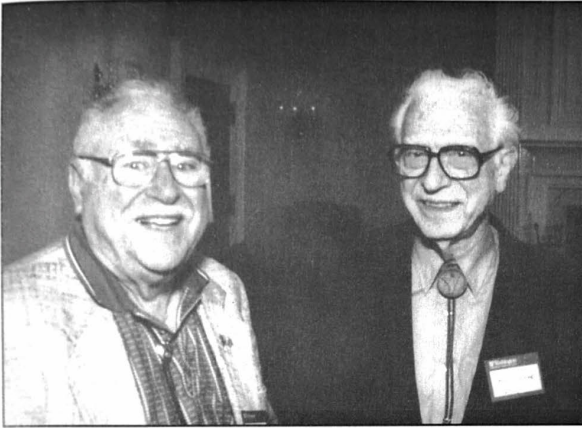

John Hara Receives the Micah Award

The American Jewish Committee - St. Louis Chapter - each year presents the Micah Award to someone whose achievements exemplify the teachings of the prophet Micah: "to do justly, to love mercy and to walk humbly with God."

John Hara, '63, was the recipient of this prestigious award on March 19, 1999. He is the first Asian-American to receive the Micah Award. Born in this country, the ninth child of an immigrant Japanese farmer, his family spent four

years during World War II in two U.S. camps for Japanese-Americans. Following his service in the U.S. Army during the Korean War, he enrolled in UCLA where he received his BA in Public Health. He then came to St. Louis where he enrolled in Washington University School of Dentistry and graduated with the Class of 1963.

Dr. Hara has been an outstanding leader and advocate for his community. He is the founder and past president of the Coalition

of Asian Pacific-Americans, a past president of the St. Louis chapter, Japanese American Citizens League and is the community relations chair for both groups. He is a board member of the Maryville University, St. Louis Japanese American Oral History project and of the St. Louis/Suwa Sister City Committee. Other activities include the St. Louis Center for International Relations; the Advisory Council for KMOX radio; the Clinical Faculty of the Washington University School of Dental

Medicine; the Midwest District Board of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights and the U.S. Equal Opportunity Commission.

He received the U.S. Army SIMA Asian Pacific American Heritage Award, the National JAACL Silver Service Award, the St. Louis City & County Police Community Service Award, and recognition from the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights, the Washington University School of Dental Medicine, and the Meramec St. Louis Community College.

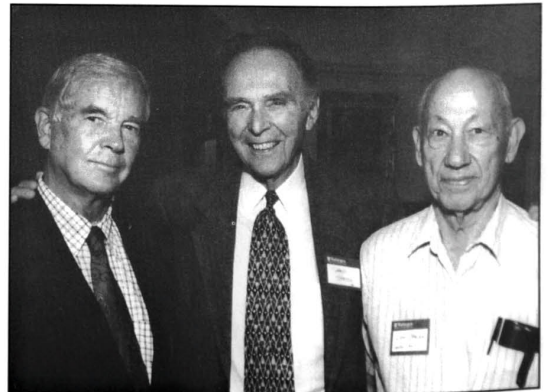

Sam Holroyd Dies: Head of Periodontics

Samuel Holroyd, former chairman of the department of periodontics, died October 25 after a long illness. He was 68.

Holroyd joined the University faculty in 1979 as professor of periodontics after retiring from a distinguished career of more than 25 years with the U.S. Navy. He received tenure in 1985 and was named professor emeritus when the dental school closed in 1991.

The author of several clinical textbooks related to pharmacology in dental practice, he then entered private practice in St. Louis, retiring in 1998 due to failing health. In 1999, he moved to Pennsylvania to be near his daughter and grandchildren.

A native of West Virginia, Holroyd enlisted in the U.S. Navy in 1952 and saw action in the Korean War. After combat duty, he

returned to his home state and enrolled in the University of West Virginia's Dental School. Upon obtaining degrees in dental surgery and medical pharmacology, he returned full time to the Navy and later received a master's degree in periodontics from Georgetown University.

Holroyd, who reached the rank of captain, was assigned

to the U.S. Navy Dental Corps, where he saw a variety of assignments, including that as chairman of the Department of Educational Resources at the Bethesda Naval Dental School in Maryland. He turned down a chance to become an admiral, opting instead to come to Washington University.

He is survived by his three children.
