David Krutchkoff, Class of 1964 2004 Distinguished Alumnus of the Year



2004 Distinguished Alumnus, David Krutchkoff.

Each year the Dental Alumni Association names a Distinguished Alumnus, and this year David J. Krutchkoff of the Class of 1964, was chosen as the recipient of this honor. He was recognized for his many outstanding contributions to dentistry and dental education, especially in the areas of Oral Pathology and Oral Diagnosis.

Dave was born in Eureka and raised in San Francisco, California. He received an A.B. in 1960 from the University of California at Berkeley. He received his D.D.S. from Washington University School of Dentistry in 1964. After receiving his dental degree, he served in the Navy until 1967. Upon completion

of his military service, Dave returned to the academic life; he received an M.S. in Oral Pathology and Oral Diagnosis in 1970 at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor.

Dave spent the next three years as an Assistant Professor at the School of Dentistry at the University of Louisville, Kentucky in the Department of Oral Pathology. He then moved to Connecticut and began his career at the University of Connecticut. He was first named as the Head of the Dental Emergency and Screening Clinic at the University of Connecticut, School of Dental Medicine. He went on to serve as an Associate Professor in

the Department of Oral Diagnosis. In 1974 he became Head of the Oral Pathology Biopsy Service for the UConn Schools of Dental Medicine and Medicine.

From 1976 through 1996, Dave served as the Director of Graduate and Residency Program in Oral Pathology and Oral Diagnosis at the University of Connecticut School of Dental Medicine. Additionally, Dave was a Professor and Division Head for the Department of Oral Diagnosis at UConn from 1982-1996. In 1996, Dave was named Professor Emeritus at the UConn School of Dental medicine.

Currently Dave continues to be an ad hoc

reviewer for the Journal of the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry, the Archives of Dermatology, the Journal of Oral Pathology, and the Journal of the American Dental Association. Dave is presently a consultant in Oral Pathology for Hartford Hospital, St. Francis Hospital, and John Dempsey Hospital, while serving on the Editorial Board and as a reviewer for Oral Surgery, Oral Medicine and Oral Pathology.

Dave currently resides in Connecticut with his wife, Sumiko. He reports that his hobbies include travel, wine appreciation and recently, home renovation. Dave and Sumiko

He received the Distinguished Alumnus Award in 1977. Many of us remember Dr. Gilster as a fair and kind instructor during dental school. He has also been a great supporter of the Alumni Association and has donated his time, energy and knowledge whenever called upon. In Dr. Gilster's name, the Alumni Association has made a contribution to the National Foundation for Ectodermal Dysplasias, a cause near and dear to Dr. Gilster.

The banquet concluded with introduction and installation of the new officers. With this, the 138th Annual Meeting came to a close.

Online Access to the Dental Collection of the Washington University Medical School Library

A sub-committee appointed by the WUSDM Alumni Association Board of Trustees met with the directors of the WU Medical School Library in October, 2004. The purpose of the meeting was to explore how the library can better serve the WUSDM alumni. With the closure of the dental school, the contents of its library were transferred to the medical school library. The Harriet Steuernagel Library Fund was established to maintain the existing collection and to provide for acquisition of new books and periodicals. Through donations and investments, the Steuernagel Fund has grown to approximately \$1.4 million. In 2004, approximately \$32,000 was used

to keep the collection current.

A number of WU alumni who live in the St. Louis area frequent the library for research and reference. The library staff has been very helpful to the alumni who utilize the resources and have added to the collection upon request. Unfortunately, it is difficult for the majority of the dental school alumni to benefit from this outstanding collection since most do not reside in St. Louis.

With universal internet access, this will be changing. Interlibrary Loan and Document Delivery (ILLIAD) service is a web-based program within the medical school library. ILLIAD members will receive a user ID and

a password and then will be able to search, access and download electronic media or receive hard-copy by fax or mail. The material available includes virtually all dental and medical publications on record.

Normally, there is a substantial "subscriber fee" to access the ILLIAD services. However, the Library Committee has negotiated an agreement with the Medical School Library that says that the "subscriber fee" will be paid for by proceeds from the Steuernagel Fund, because the fund operates with a surplus. The annual investment for the subscriptions and other acquisitions will not be reduced by this additional expenditure.

The access ID and password registration to the WU Medical School Library program must be administered by the WUSDM Alumni Association Board of Directors. Establishing and maintaining the user list will require a considerable amount of time and effort. Logistics have yet to be worked out, however registration and renewal for access to the ILLIAD program will likely be a part of the annual WUSDM Alumni Association membership process.

This is a tremendous opportunity for our alumni and the WUSDM Alumni Association will make every effort to implement the program as soon as possible.

NFED Establishes the "John E. Gilster Award"

The National Foundation for Ectodermal Dysplasias (NFED) Board of Directors announced the establishment of the John E. Gilster, DDS Outstanding Service Through Dentistry Award at the Access to Oral Health Care Workshop on Friday, October 8th, 2004, at Saint Louis University. Mary Kaye Richter announced the award on behalf of the Board of Directors and presented a plaque commemorating the award to Dr. Gilster.

As necessary, the Board will bestow the award on any individual actively involved in dentistry or its allied partners who have exhibited a long standing commit-

ment to the NFED, its dental programs and patients affected by ED.

Dr. Gilster is one of three individuals who incorporated the NFED, on December 24, 1981 in Mascoutah, Illinois. He served on the NFED Board of Directors from 1981 through 2003 and now serves as an Emeritus member. He served as Treasurer and Vice-Chairman and as a member on the Treatment Fund Committee, the Executive Committee, the Scholarship Committee, and the golf tournament committee. Dr. G. helped write *A Dental Guide to the Ectodermal Dysplasia Syndromes* as well as articles related to dentistry and ED, and he

participated in Family Conferences.

Dr. Gilster attended the University of Illinois and graduated from Washington University School of Dentistry in 1944. He practiced pediatric dentistry and taught the subject from 1950 through the mid 1980s at Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri. He has been a member and chairman of the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry and was a member of the Missouri Board of Pediatric Dentistry. His other affiliations are with the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry, the American Society of Dentistry for Children and the American

Association of Dental Schools. Dr. Gilster has also served as Editor of the St. Louis Dental Society Bulletin (1953-1963), the Missouri Dental Journal (1963-1973), and Editor of the Washington University Dental Alumni Newsletter. In 1970, he served as president of the American Association of Dental Editors. In 1977, he was named the Distinguished Alumnus by the Washington University Dental Alumni Association having served as its President in 1969. He treated children affected by ectodermal dysplasia for more than 30 years beginning in the early 1950's.

Alumni and Development Update

from David Jolley - Alumni Liaison with Main Campus

Gifts from alumni and friends supporting the Harriett Steuernagel Library Fund continue to come in to the Medical School Library. The following chart illustrates the gift totals:

Funds spent during FY04 and to keep the Steuernagel Collection current - Approx. \$32,000

(Funds are used to pay for journal renewal subscriptions, individual purchases of dental titles and electronic journals and OVID licenses. In addition, a 10 set DVD collection was purchased from a conference of the 89th American Academy of Periodontology. Additional money, not spent during a fiscal year is plowed back into the endowment)

On-line access to the Bernard Becker Medical School Library:

Access to the Bernard Becker Medical School Library on-line collection is available through: becker.wustl.edu. You can view all electronic resources as well as recommend new purchases as well.

The Library is looking at making resources of the rare book collection available for electronic access during 2005-06.

The Library continues to add dental journals to their on-line collection of general medical and dental resources. OVID, the on-line collection access is available to all alumni and dental practitioners for a \$52.00 annual fee.

The Library is planning to continue to move more toward on-line access of its collections, and is therefore planning to designate space for this electronic search mode. Would the Dental Alumni Assn. be interested in designating Steuernagel funds (over and above the annual amount needed for regular renewal and upkeep of Collection) for this effort? Recognition to Harriett and the Alumni Assn. would be located in this new area.

The Harriett Steuernagel Award of the Dental Section of the MLA (Medical Library Association) has been established to annually recognize the efforts of a health sciences librarian who has contributed to the growth and development of the Dental Section. A donation of \$10,000 was contributed in 2002 by the WU Medical School Library (from the Steuernagel Library Fund at WU) to provide an endowment that funds this annual award.

The 2005 Earl Shepard Memorial Lecture is scheduled for April 20, 2005 from 9:00 am to 11:00 am at the Eric P. Newman Educational Center. The speaker will be Dr. James Vaden, Chairman of the Orthodontic Dept. of the University of Tennessee School of Dentistry.

The heirs of Dr. and Mrs. Earl Shepard endowed the Dept. of Otolaryngology at WUSM with a fund to endow a lectureship series. In 1994, a sum of \$50,000 was used to establish the endowment. The following chart illustrates the fund's \$ history:

The Kimbrough Trust – An Update

Articles in the last two newsletters have followed the court proceedings involving the trust of Joseph B. Kimbrough, Class of 1894. He died in 1963 at the age of 93, never having married. His trust, established in 1945, provided benefits for a great-niece and two great-nephews. Upon their deaths, the estate was to go to the Washington University Dental Alumni fund. At that time, the value of the estate was approxi-

mately \$3 million.

There were three parties who undertook legal action to claim the estate, WU school of Dental Medicine Alumni Association, Washington University and two heirs of Dr. Kimbrough, two great-great-nieces.

The first decision, in 2002, was in favor of Washington University. The assets were to be used "to create a Kimbrough Chair in Cleft Palate/Craniofacial

Deformities or Maxillofacial Surgery and Prosthodontics for teaching and healing, only."

The following year the decision was appealed by Dr. Kimbrough's two great-great-nieces. In 2003, the original decision was reversed by the Missouri Court of Appeals and the judgment was awarded to the great-great-nieces.

Washington University appealed the 2003 decision. In June of 2004, the

Missouri Supreme Court reversed the Missouri Court of Appeals. Their decision agreed with the original decision in 2002, declaring Washington University should receive the proceeds of the estate and stated that "the trust can be used to continue treatment of dental patients, research, and postgraduate education in dental medicine."

The Alumni Association did not participate in either appeal.
